

Statement 1: Mission and Content of the Cadastre 2014 Situation in Slovakia: the statement is fulfilled only partially

Statement 2: Organization of the Cadastre 2014 Situation in Slovakia : the statement is applied fully

Statement 3: A Changing Role of Maps in the Cadastre 2014

Situation in Slovakia: the statement is applied fully

"Cadastre 2014" a vision for the future cadastral system

Statement 4: Information Technology in the Cadastre 2014

Situation in Slovakia: the statement is being applied

Statement 5: Privatization in the Cadastre 2014 Situation in Slovakia: the statement is implemented to a considerable extent

Statement 6: Cost recovery in the Cadastre 2014 Situation in Slovakia: the statement is not applied

Cadastral vision - a pan-European view

- Cross-border interconnectivity of information systems
- Clarification of cadastral funding (open data vs. cost recovery)
- Homogenization of cadastral systems (different definitions of cadastral terms such as: property, lot, parcel; what kind of buildings are to be included; how to manage underground property, etc.)

Cadastral vision - a pan-European view

- Clear EU recommendations, which could help in that homogenization
- Preparation of a common multilingual terminological dictionary with the interpretation in one (two? three?) EU languages
- Education updating in the real estate Cadastre

Cadastral vision - a national view

- Education improvement related to the Cadastre at technical and law universities, including postgraduate education
- Systematic consolidation of ownership relations to properties registered in the E-register and their mass transfer to the C-register
- Addressing of unsatisfactory architecture of the cadastral information system and data security improvement

Cadastral vision - a national view

- Provide services for e-Government
- Update and access the cadastral information system in real time
- Collaborate more with the private sector
